Lee B. Heilner Jr.

...of Littleton, veteran of 2 wars; 75

LITTLETON — Lee B. Heilner Jr., 75, a retired security guard who served in two wars, died Saturday, Jan. 25, at his home in Littleton after a brief illness. He was the husband of Mary (Nolan) Heilner.



He was born in New York City on Dec. 19, 1927, a son of the late Lee and Ann (Nicholas) Heilner, and grew up in Maine.

He enlisted in the Army at 17, and served during World War II and the Korean War.

Mr. Heilner was married in 1955, and settled in Littleton. He worked in the construction business and prior to retiring, was employed as a security guard at various businesses, including Warren Manufacturing, and XRE for 12 years, both in Littleton.

He was a member of the Littleton Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 6556, where he served in many positions.

Besides his wife, survivors include a son, Lee J. Heilner of Littleton; three daughters, Deborah Heilner of Westford, Tammy Priest of Lunenburg and Dawn Rice of Westford; two sisters, Caroline Kacensky of Pittsfield and Lena Morrison of California; also eight grandchildren, one great-grandchild, two nephews and one niece.
