LITTLETON — Doris E. (Owen) Jordan, 94, a longtime Littleton resident and a former hostess at a landmark Westford restaurant, died Saturday, March 23, at Emerson Hospital in Concord after a brief illness. She was married for 53 years to Vincent F. Jordan, who died in 1988.

She was born in Leominster, on Oct. 24, 1907, a daughter of James and Rose (Gonyea) Owen. She graduated from Leominster High School, and the Fitchburg Normal School.
