CHESTER, Va. — JoAnne E. (Wright) Lyons, 66, a Chester resident who previously lived in Littleton, Mass., for 65 years, where she had been an active member of her local parish, died Tuesday, April 24, at John Randolph Medical Center in Hopewell. She was the wife of William "Barnacle Bill" Lyons, who died in 1997.

She was born in Ayer, on July 14, 1940, daughter of the late Walter and Ellen (Peterson) Wright and graduated from Littleton High School in 1958. She received her bachelor's degree in education from the University of Massachusetts Amherst in 1962.

She taught for two years at the Nahnasset School in Westford and later was a substitute teacher in the Littleton school system in the 1970s.

Mrs. Lyons was a member of the First Baptist Church in Littleton where she was a life deaconess, a member of the choir and the women's fellowship. After residing in Littleton her entire life, Mrs. Lyons moved to Virginia last year.
