Fifty- year Littleton Resident

TARPON SPRINGS, FL — Mary Adelaide Harvey Andrews, a resident of Littleton, MA for 50 years, died January 13, 2009 at the Peninsula Rehab and Nursing Home in Tarpon Springs, FL. In 2005 she moved to assisted living near her daughter, Lynn Stanford, in Tarpon Springs, FL. Mary was the daughter of Albert and Sarah Adelaide Harvey; she was born on August 26, 1922 in Drewrys Bluff, VA and was the youngest of 8 children. Mary was the loving wife to Charles E. Andrews for 45 years and mother of 4 children, grandmother of 9, and great grandmother of 8.



As an Army wife, she followed Charles to San Bernadino, CA, Paso Aroblio, CA, Kobe, Japan, Fort Lee, VA, Camp A.P. Hill, VA, Liepheim, Germany, and Ft Devens, MA (Devens Crest and Littleton) taking their growing family with her. While stationed at Fort Devens, Charles and Mary were managers at the candy concession at the 6 theaters on post. She worked at the Rolling Pin Bakery in Acton from 1958 to 1962. She left the bakery to become a bookkeeper for the Littleton Electric Light & Water Dept. in 1962. Mary retired from the Light & Water Dept. in 1977.

Mary was an active member of the Littleton Congregational Church in various capacities.

She was probably best know for her flower arrangements for Sunday Services. She was a member and often held an officer's position of the Littleton Grange, Kings Daughters and Retired Officers Club. Mary was the first spouse to become president of the local chapter of the Retired Officers Club. She worked as a volunteer at the Fort Devens Hospital and at the Shaker Lane School, and was active with the Council on Aging and often helped and substituted at the Senior Center Meal Site. She also enjoyed playing bridge with her friends.

Mary is survived by her sister, Edna May Cook of California, her children, Forest Andrews and his wife Karen of Illinois, Harry Andrews and his wife Lena of New Mexico, Lynn Stanford and her husband Rodney of Florida, and Charlotte Boston of Maine, 9 grandchildren and 7 of 8 great grandchildren.
