

## James E. Nolan Jr.

### ... Littleton, machinist, bus driver; 80

LITTLETON — James E. Nolan Jr., 80, a longtime Littleton resident who had worked as a machinist and as a bus driver, died



Wednesday, April 3, at Life Care Center of Nashoba Valley. He was the husband of Marcia (LeClair)

Nolan, to whom he was married for 59 years.

He was born in West Concord, a son of the late James and Bertha (Moore) Nolan, and grew up in Littleton. He graduated from Littleton High School in 1937. Following his marriage in 1943, he lived in Shirley for several years before relocating to Littleton in 1962.

During World War II, he served in the U.S. Army and fought in the Battle of the Bulge, Normandy, Northern France, Rhineland, Ardennes, and Central Europe.

Mr. Nolan worked as a machinist at Simond Saw Co. in Fitchburg for more than 35 years before his retirement. He later worked as a bus driver for the Acton-Boxboro school system for several years.

He was a communicant of St. Anne's Church in Littleton.

Besides his wife, survivors include two sons, James E. Nolan III of Ayer and John J. Nolan of Dracut; a daughter, Janice Kendall of Westford; three grandchildren, Jim Nolan IV, Shelley Favreau and Kimberly Fahle; and two great-grandchildren, Cassie and Nicole Nolan.
