GROTON — Marcia "Auntie Marcia" (LeClair) Nolan, 84, of Groton, a former long-time Littleton resident, died accidentally, Monday, Oct. 31. She was the wife of James R. Nolan Jr., who died in 2002.

She was born in Germanville, Canada, on Sept. 19, 1921, a daughter of the late Evariste and Rose Anne (Desautel) LeClair. She grew up in Leominster, and lived in Fitchburg and Shirley before moving to Littleton in 1962. She recently became a resident of Groton.

At the age of 14, Mrs. Nolan was a nanny for a local family. She later learned to be a seamstress and worked as a stitcher at Cluet Factory. She also cared for many children and foster children.

She was a member of St. Anne's Church in Littleton.

Mrs. Nolan enjoyed walking.

She is survived by four children and their spouses, James Nolan III and Margaret Nolan of Littleton, John J. and Sally Nolan of Dracut, and Janice and the Rev. Wayne Kendall of Westford; three grandchildren; two great-grandchildren; and a great-great-grandson.
