Charles J. Ware, 90, of Grove Street, Concord, died Tuesday, Sept. 20, at Emerson Hospital in Concord. He was the husband of Margaret K. (Sullivan) Ware.

Born in Fitchburg on July 23, 1898, he was the son of the late George H. and Mary Agnes (Dunn) Ware. He attended Fitchburg parochial schools.

During World War I, Mr. Ware served in the U.S. Army with the 41st Balloon Co. Air Service.

In 1933, Mr. Ware began his career as an instructor in textiles at the Concord Reformatory, retiring in 1963 as the shop manager. He was also employed part time for several years at Dovre

Ski Binding Co. in West Concord.

A longtime resident of Concord, he was a member of the Holy Name Society of Our Lady Help of Christians Church.

In addition to his wife, survivors include three daughters, Mary T. Schmidt and Margaret L. Banks, both of Coventry, Conn., and Kathryn W. Johnson of Littleton; two sisters, Mary Beauvais and Kathryn McManus, both of Fitchburg; 13 grandchildren and five great-grandchildren. He was also the father of the late Robert J. Ware.

Funeral was held Saturday, Sept. 24, from the Joseph Dee &

Son Funeral Home, Concord, followed by a funeral Mass in Our Lady Help for Christians Church, west Concord. Celebrant of the Mass was the Rev. John H. Curley. Serving as pallbearers were Robert and Richard Schmidt, Sean and Kevin Banks, Kenneth Johnson Jr. and Kyle Johnson, Kelly Ware and James Shanahan.

Burial followed in Westlawn Cemetery, Littleton.

Concord's town flag was at half-staff on Saturday in honor of Mr. Ware's World War I Army service.
