What is the Littleton Shade Tree Committee?

The Shade Tree Committee is a group of volunteers, appointed by the Select Board, plus the Tree Warden, for the purpose of purchasing, planting and cultivating public shade trees in or near public ways. The Committee also promotes a healthy and sustainable community forest by planting quality trees and providing education and advocacy to the public on the benefits of trees.

Goal: The goal of the STC is to work in close cooperation with town departments, homeowners, and businesses on matters that affect Littleton's trees in order to preserve and improve a sustainable community forest.



Why is this important to me?

Trees make our community more beautiful and more resilient. They cool our community and clean the air. They help filter drinking water supplies and reduce flooding from storm events. Our community trees also support a huge variety of pollinators and wildlife!

Community Forest and Shade Tree Facts

- Trees provide natural cooling and consume carbon dioxide.
- A mature tree can lower home energy use between 100 to 250 kilowatt-hours per year.
- Having large trees in yards along streets increases a home's value.
- Access to trees, green spaces, and parks promotes greater physical activity, and reduces stress, while improving the quality of life in our town.
