## Mary Ford ... of Littleton, was farmer and teacher

LITTLETON — Mary (Allender) Ford, 90, of Warren Street, died Wednesday, April 21, at Deaconess Nashoba Hospital in Ayer. She was the wife of Marion S. Ford, whom she married in 1931.

She was born in Havre de Grace, Md., on July 7, 1908, and graduated from Havre de Grace High School. She later graduated from Towson Normal School and was an elementary school teacher in a one-room schoolhouse.

Mrs. Ford was a riveter in an airplane factory during World War II, and later became a farmer. She then returned to teaching after earning a B.S. degree in education at age 50 from the University of Delaware.

Mrs. Ford had lived in Littleton for the past 12 years, and was a member of the National Education Society.

Survivors include two sons, John M. Ford of Snowflake, Ariz., and William R.B. Ford of Billerica; a daughter, Patricia F. Foster of Littleton; five grandchildren, Jessica and her husband Bill Loveday of Gulfport, Miss., Charles and his wife Rene Bradshaw of Hollis, N.H., Geraldine and her husband Paul Bertozzi of Shirley, John R. Ford of Louisiana and Andrew and his wife Keri Bradshaw of Lunenburg; and six great-grandchildren.
