

Paul Fletcher, Long Active In Littleton Affairs, Dies

LITTLETON — Paul Daland Fletcher, 94 Goldsmith St. and a lifelong resident of this town died Wednesday afternoon at Peter Bent Brigham Hospital in Boston.

Born April 22, 1899 in Littleton, he was the son of the late Elmer Warren Fletcher and Minnie W. (Hartwell) Fletcher.

Educated in Littleton he graduated from Littleton High School and Bryant Stratton Business College. He was employed at the United Elastic Corporation in Littleton where he worked until the time of his death, a period of almost forty years.

He served as light and water commissioner in the town of Littleton for 15 years. He was a member of the Tahattawan Lodge of Masons and a member and former Treasurer of the Ayer Rotary Club.
