LITTLETON — John S. "Jack" Hunt, 67, died yesterday, Jan. 24, at his home after a long battle with cancer. He was the husband of Phyllis (Harrington) Hunt.

 He was born in Littleton on Feb. 28, 1933, a son of the late Irving and Margaret (Knox) Hunt. A lifelong resident of Littleton, he was graduated from the Shattuck Street School in 1951.

Mr. Hunt served in the U.S. Army during the Korean Conflict.

He worked as a lineman for the Littleton Highway Department and Light Department for 47 years, retiring three years ago.
